

Town of Plainfield Traffic Ordinance

Pursuant to Vermont Statute Title 23, Section 1007 and 1008, Title 24, Sections 1971 and 2291 subsections 1, 4, and 5, and such other general enactments as may be material hereto, and Sections 301-305; Ordinances, of the Town Charter; the Selectboard of the Town of Plainfield hereby ordains:

SPEED REGULATIONS

All unpaved roads in the Town of Plainfield outside the village limits shall have a speed limit of 35 mph.

The speed limit on all roads within the village are as follows:

1. A maximum speed of 25 mph for TH3, (Main Street), for its entire length.
2. A maximum speed of 25 mph for TH9, (Creamery Street), for its entire length.
3. A maximum speed of 25 mph for TH1, (Mill Street), for its entire length.
4. A maximum speed of 25 mph for TH2, (Brook Road), from intersection with SA1, (Barre Hill Road), to intersection with TH18, (Cameron Road).
5. A maximum speed of 25 mph for TH10, (Hudson Avenue), for its entire length.
6. A maximum speed of 30 mph for TH1, (Barre Hill), for its entire length.
7. A maximum speed of 30 mph for TH11, (Recreation Field Road), for its entire length.
8. A maximum speed of 30 mph for TH12 (Walker Lane), for its entire length.
9. A maximum speed of 30 mph for TH37, (Martin Meadow Road), for its entire length.
10. A maximum speed of 30 mph for TH 36, (Towne Avenue), for its entire length.

PARKING REGULATIONS

1. It shall be unlawful to park at any time on either side of the Winooski River bridge or for 20 feet east onto SA3, (Main Street).
2. It shall be unlawful to park in front of the Fire Station or on Main Street across from the Fire Station.
3. There is a 1:00pm to 6:00am parking ban for all vehicles in the parking areas beside and behind the Fire Station except for Emergency personnel.
4. It shall be unlawful to park in the Route 2 Town Hall parking lot, except for municipal use in the building or to attend an approved function at the Town Hall.
5. It shall be unlawful to use the Mill Street parking lot across from the Grace United Methodist Church on SA1, (Mill Street), for long-term storage, abandonment, or major repairs of vehicles. Vehicles left overnight must be moved from said lot by 8:00am following snowfalls to allow for plowing.
6. Any vehicle parked on town property for more than 72 consecutive hours, without being moved, may be considered abandoned by the Town, in which case written notice will be delivered to owner of intent to remove said vehicle, and vehicle will be towed and stored at owner's expense.
7. There is a 1:00pm to 6:00am parking ban for all vehicles on all municipal streets and roads from December 1st to April 30th of each year.
8. It shall be unlawful to park a vehicle on any sidewalk in the town for longer than fifteen minutes.
9. There is a winter ban of vehicular traffic and parking at the Recreation Field in effect from December 1st to April 30th of each year.
10. Any vehicle parked in violation of the provisions of this parking ordinance may be summarily removed at the owner's expense, by order of any Selectboard member, Town Constable, or any other Law Enforcement Officer.

This ordinance shall be effective upon final passage by the Plainfield Selectboard as per Sections 301-305; Ordinances, Enforcement and Adoption, of the Town Charter.
